BRIEF SUMMARY OF AMNESTY 'ADOPTION'  
and 'INVESTIGATION' CASES IN

BRAZIL

- I Lourival Almeida de AGUIAR: Student at university of Fortaleza in state of Ceara. She was arrested on 13th May 1970 for allegedly belonging to the 'Trotskyist-Bolshevik' faction of the Partido Revolucionario Operario. We are trying to confirm reports of her release. S 1  
Lawyer: Wanda Rita Othon Sidou Germany 107
- I Jose Ferreira de LENCAR: Anthropologist; arrested with his two daughters as he sought asylum in Mexican Embassy. Is now at liberty but waiting trial and group is therefore still continuing inquiries. Mis. 2  
Lawyer: Unknown Germany 196
- A Father Gerson da Conceicao de Almeida: Catholic priest who disappeared on 3rd October 1971 with a sociologist Lucio de Brito Castelo Branco. He was apparently arrested for his involvement in FASE (Federacao dos Orgaos para Assistencia Social e Educacional) which was the subject of a police inquiry. He alleges that he has been mal-treated and refused a doctor. He was acquitted at a trial in July but awaits the outcome of a further trial. C 2

- + I Marcia Aparecida AMARAL: Student at the School of Medicine in Sao Paulo; was arrested at the home of her parents sometime shortly before mid-March 1972. Her parents were not told where she was being taken, but she is reported to be held at the OBAN headquarters. SM 3

- + A Maria AMELIA: Nurse at Aracatuba in Sao Paulo state. Arrested sometime after the 15th February 1973 following the arrest of professor Luis Basilio Rossi. The motive for her arrest seems to be her acquaintanceship with Rossi. M 3

- I Luis Antonio dos Santos ARANOVITCH: Student at the university of Rio Grande do Sul. The prisoner was arrested around the 1st May 1970, accused of membership in the Trotskyite-Bolshevik faction of the Revolutionary Workers Party. S 4

- I Vanderlan Antonio de ARAUJO: Ex-president of the DEC(students) cultural centre) of Federal University of Goias. He is accused of having made speeches in March 1969 against the national security. He disappeared 3 years ago in summer 1970. S 5

- A Paulo Otavio AZEVEDO Junior: Arrested in early 1970 accused of having tried to re-establish cells of the extinct Communist Party in three towns of Sao Paulo state. 3

- I Alailton de Lima BARBOSA: Student at university of Rio de Janeiro, accused of belonging to a student movement which organised strikes and promoted university reforms. Has been held since early 1970. S 2  
 Lawyer: Unknown Germany 91
- A Edmar Vieira BARRETO: Accused of trying to re-establish the extinct Partido Comunista Brasileiro in Brazil. Varying reports of the sentence passed on him have been received, ranging between 2 and 4 years. 6

- I Jaime Larry BENCHIMOL: Student accused of participating in student demonstrations during Rockefeller's visit to Brazil in 1969. Said to have confessed, under interrogation, to being member of MR-8. S 2

- A Lucio de Brito Castelo BRANCO: Sociologist who works for FASE (see Gerson da Conceicao de Almeida). Very bad torture of this prisoner has been reported; on release (he is still awaiting trial) he had the mental age of a child of eight years old. Mis.2

- A Fernando de BRITO: Dominican priest held in 1969 for involvement with ALN and the guerrilla Marighela; he was sentenced to four years' imprisonment in his trial which took place in September 71. He is one of the three Dominican priests involved in the hunger strike which took place recently in Sao Paulo (See circular sent to groups in June 72 with regard to Church-State relations). According to our latest information they are all three still being held in a common-law prison which is at a great distance from Sao Paulo. C 3

- A Fabio Vieira BRUNO: Accused of trying to establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Brasilia. Sentenced to one year and now released but group are still trying to get in contact with him. 6

- + I Elisa Lustosa Cardoso CAILLEAU: Student at state university of Rio de Janeiro in school of social services. Accused of 'subversive activities' at the university and in student circles. Reported acquitted and released. Unconfirmed. S.Mis. 2

- I Wanderley CAIXE: 10 year sentence for 'subversive activities' in Ribeirao Preto and for alleged involvement in formation of FLN (frente de Libertacao Nacional). Case was dropped previously because of inability to progress on investigation but recent developments which may allow the group to contact their prisoner directly - and ascertain whether he is a prisoner of conscience or not - has led to the file being opened again. 7/3

- I Gerson CHENICHARRO: Sentenced to 4 years for subversive activities before 1964 at a trial in the municipality of Mage. Trial held in 1970. 2

- A Carlos Alberto Libanio CRISTO: Dominican priest arrested in October 1969 for alleged involvement with terrorism. Sentenced to 4 years. One of the 3 Dominican priests involved in the hunger strike which took place in June 72 in Sao Paulo (See circular on church-state relations in Brazil). According to our latest information they are all three in a common law prison on the borders of Sao Paulo state. C 3

- +I Vera Medina COELI: Teacher, student, employee of Brazilian newspaper O Globo. Arrested 6th April 1970 when two men, at first believed to be kidnappers, but later reported to be from the security services, dragged her into a car. The groups initially working on the case closed down without learning anything new about the case, so the case sheet was written up with further suggestions for investigation. TSJ 2

- I Jose DAMIÃO: Law student at the state university of Sao Paulo and member of the Students Union (UNE). He was reported to have been badly tortured and held incommunicado. SL 3

- A Rogério Jose DIAS: Convicted in a group of 28 people for attempting to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Brasilia. Member of the Armed Forces; allegedly participated in the IV Metropolitan Conference of the PCB in 1967. In 1972, the Supreme Military Court upheld a 6½ year sentence. 6

- I Jaine Nello D'YK: Accused of subversive activities. Judge who tried the original case was accused by the defence lawyers of 'errors, abuses and violations'. Confession allegedly obtained through torture. 6

- A Luis Carlos Henrique FERNANDES: Accused of trying to re-establish cells of the extinct Communist Party in three towns of Sao Paulo. 3  
 Lawyer: Unknown Germany 278

- + A Esther de Figueiredo FERRAZ: Government official in the Secretariat of Education in state of Sao Paulo; present whereabouts unknown; arrested sometime after the arrest of Luis Basilio Rossi on the 15th February 1973; motive for arrest was probably her acquaintanceship with Rossi. C/S 3

- A Jorge Galvao Fidelino de FIGUEIREDO: Graduate in economics of Catholic University of Sao Paulo and formerly economics editor of Brazilian magazine 'Visao'. Reportedly tortured. Case raised at Commission on Press Freedom of the Inter-American Press Association. After several months of detention - when the authorities would not even admit that he was arrested - he was brought to trial and sentenced to four years for 'spreading subversive propaganda'. JMIs 3

- A Ricardo Alberto Aguado GOMES: Convicted with group of 28 people on charges of attempting to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Brasilia. Three year sentence passed and upheld by Superior Military Tribunal in June 72. 6

- A Mario GUIMARAES: Convicted in a group of 28 people for attempting to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Brasilia. Sentences of 2 and 5 years have been reported to have been passed by the military court in Brasilia, but recent reports of his release are also being investigated. 6

- I Orlando JACINTO: Sentenced in the municipality of Mage for subversive activities undertaken before 1964. Sentenced in 1970. 2

- A Nelson Jose JAPAULA: Accused with 19 others of having tried to re-establish cells of the extinct Communist Party in 3 towns of the state of Sao Paulo. Preventative imprisonment requested by DOPS in 1970. No news of eventual sentence or acquittal. 3

- +I Teresa Maria de Paula JOCA: Student at the Faculty of Philosophy and Social Sciences at Fortaleza university. Arrested in May 1970 and accused of membership in the 'Trotskyist-Bolshevik' faction of the Workers Revolutionary Party. Reports of her release some time ago are being investigated. SAMIs.1

- A Israelis KAIROVSKY: Engineer arrested in Sao Paulo in March 1971. Believed to have been arrested after receiving a letter from a friend who had recently left Brazil, in which this departure was explained. Reportedly badly tortured. Mis. 3

- I Darci von KOOHOLTZ: Former state deputy in Rio Grande do Sul. Deprived of political rights and sentenced in January 1970 for acts considered subversive and for inciting class strife. Sentence was 2½ years so that should be released in Summer 1972; we are trying to confirm this. Dep. 4

- A Francisco Ribeiro LEITE: Convicted in a group of 28 people accused of attempting to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Brasilia. Conflicting reports of 2 and 5 year sentences have been received. 6

- A Jose LEITE Filho: Journalist; ex deputy; arrested in February 1973; was still being held incommunicado as of March 1973. Suffers from serious heart trouble. J 8  
Lawyer: Antonio Modesto Silveira (?) Germany 459

- I Luis Carlos LEITE: 24 yrs old; former student who gave up studies to help family financially. Arrested along with his father (Jose Leite Filho) in February 1973 and held incommunicado until March 73 at least. S 8  
Lawyer: Antonio Modesto Silveira New Zealand 10
- A Ivo do Amaral LESBAUPIN: Dominican priest arrested in 1969 for alleged involvement with ALN and guerrilla leader Marighela. Charged with driving a car to transport guerrillas and helping them to flee when they were sought by the police. C 3  
Sentenced to four years in his trial which took place in September 1971. One of 3 Dominicans taking part in hunger strike of June 72 in Sao Paulo (see church-state relations circular). Latest information reports that he is still held in the common law prison on the borders of Sao Paulo state.

- I Vitor Antonio LETIZIA: Student at university of Rio Grande do Sul. Arrested May 1970 for membership in a 'subversive organisation'; police confiscated pamphlets and a clandestine printing press. Was being held in the barracks of the 19th Infantry Regiment in Sao Leopoldo near Porto Alegre. No news as to final sentence or acquittal. Studied in England at one time. S 4

\* I Germana Correia LIMA: Doctor of law, arrested Spring 1969 and held in Recife. The case was originally taken up in February 1970 but was again written up in December of 1972 when the groups working on the case closed down without making any appreciable progress. L 2

A Joao Ferraz de LIMA: Convicted in a group of 28 people in Brasilia charged with attempting to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Brasilia. Conflicting sentences of 2 and 5 years have been reported; yet it is thought that he may be released very shortly. 4

I Manuel Ferreira de LIMA: Sentenced to 4 years in the municipality of Nape for subversive activities before 1964. Sentenced in 1970. 2

A Nicanor Augusto de LIMA: Civil servant; married; age unknown. Arrested in May 1966 in Nilopolis, Rio de Janeiro. Held at Prison Vila Militar, state of Guanabara. May now have been released, but still no confirmation. C/S 2

A Joao Ribamar LOPES: Convicted in a group of 28 people in Brasilia on charges of attempting to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Brasilia. Conflicting sentences of 2 1/2 and 5 1/2 years are reported. Lawyer. 6

Lawyer: Unknown Germany 57

A Osvaldo Jose LOPENDO: Accused with 13 others of trying to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Sao Joao de Meriti. The financial sector was specifically accused of raising funds through publication of pamphlets, raffles, picnics, excursions, monthly contributions and one day's salary per month. Reported sentence 2 months. May now be free. 2

\* A Maria Helena Numan MACHADO: Student at the university of Rio Grande do Sul. Arrested in May 1970 with other students accused of subversive activities. - I Ismael MESQUITA: Sentenced to two years in the municipality of Mage for subversive activities before 1964. Seeking confirmation of his release. 2

- I Jose Roberto MICHELAZZO: Student, sentenced to 2½ years imprisonment for having actively participated in a student demonstration in Sao Paulo at the end of 1968. Involved in other trials as well. S 3  
 Lawyer: Unknown Netherlands 11
- I Sergio Teles MOREIRA: Arrested in August 1970 when a fire broke out in the central police station in Rio. Prisoners were transferred and Moreira, a student, held an impromptu meeting when they arrived at the police station in the praça da Republica. Taken to Secretaria da Seguranca where he is reported to have been held incommunicado. No more details. S 2  
 Lawyer: Unknown Denmark 51
- I Aurea MORETI: Sentenced to 6 years for "subversive activities" carried out since 1966 in Ribeirao Preto. Previously detained in Penitenciaría Feminina in Sao Paulo. No groups working on the case at present. 3
- A Antonio MOURAÕ Filho: Doctor; held since January 1971 on charge of subversive activities. He is accused of having given over the use of some of his property in Petropolis (state of Rio de Janeiro) to a friend who used it for subversive meetings. Is apparently free, but proceedings against him continue. M 2  
 Lawyer: Augusto de Sussekind Moraes Rego Germany 178
- A Joaquim Gasparino NETO: Convicted in a group of 28 persons in Brasilia for attempting to re-establish the extinct Partido Comunista Brasileiro in Brasilia. Conflicting reports of 2½ and 5½ years. 6  
 Lawyer: Unknown Germany 369  
 Netherlands 52



- A Mauro Correa NEVES: DOPS asked for his preventative imprisonment, along with 19 other persons, for attempting to re-establish cells of the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in 3 towns in Sao Paulo. Is apparently now free but this has not been confirmed by government officials. 3

- I Renato Ferreira NUNES: Journalist. Arrest seems to have been in connection with his journalistic activities; held in special prison of the Marechal Caetano de Faria regiment in Guanabara. Reportedly suffering from visual difficulties which need special treatment. J 2

- A Luis Medeiros de OLIVEIRA: Student of engineering; arrested in northern Brazil while carrying out study of peasant and factory workers. Was allegedly badly tortured and attempted suicide. He is paralysed and was held in Recife hospital under police observation. He was released in January 1973 but the groups are still following the case. SMis 8

- A Mario da Silva OLIVEIRA: Convicted in a group of 28 people in Brasilia for attempting to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party. Reportedly sentenced to 2½ years. 6

- I Andre Tsumoto OTA: Physics student at the state university of Sao Paulo; allegedly badly tortured. Permission was given him by the appeal court to see his lawyer but the authorities at the OBAN headquarters, where he was held, refused permission. SMis. 3

Lawyer: Unknown Germany 428
- A Reginaldo da PAIXAO: Tradesman or clerk (comerciaro) arrested end of 1969/beginning 1970 in Rio. One child; no formal charges as far as is known. Detained between May and July 70 in Presidio do Pelotao de Investigações Criminais do Quartel do 1 Exército in Rio. Cl. 2

Lawyer: Unknown Germany 325
- A Euclides PECANHA Filho: Accused with 15 others of re-organising the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Sao Joao de Meriti. See case of Osvaldo Jose Lourenco for specific charges against the financial sector. Believed to have been acquitted, but uncertain whether he has been released. 2

- + A Angelina PERALVA: 21yrs old; student in social sciences in the state university of Rio. Allegedly tortured. She is now free but returned to Brazil from abroad to face trial and the groups are still following the case. SMis. 2

I Antonio Carlos Melo PEREIRA: Geology student at the university of Sao Paulo; arrested 1970 and held at OBAN headquarters contrary to orders from the Supreme Military Tribunal to have him transferred to prison. Accused of subversive activities. Allegedly driven mad under torture. SMis. 3

I Jorge Goncalves PEREIRA: Engineer, involved in trial of 65 persons cited under various articles of the Law of National Security. Said to have escaped but other prisoners saw him at the army police headquarters. In December 1971 the trial was postponed in order that he might be located. Mis 2

Lawyer: Unknown Germany 427

A Maristela Scofield PIMENTA: Was held by the Second Army accused of having harboured a fugitive in her home and belonging to PR dos Trabalhadores. Is now free but awaiting trial so groups still are keeping an eye on case. 3

Luxembourg 1

A Paulo Esper PIMENTA: Held along with his wife, Maristela Scofield Pimenta, on charges of harbouring fugitive and membership in PR dos Trabalhadores. Now free awaiting trial so groups are still keeping an eye on case. 3

Netherlands 46

A Joao Adolfo Castro Costa PINTO: Journalist; involved in two suits, one related to attempts to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in 3 towns in Sao Paulo. Reportedly J went mad under torture and was sent to Manicomio Judiciario-Franco da Rocha in the state of Sao Paulo. Acquitted on one suit, other suit pending. 3

A Ademar Alvarenga PRADO: Accused of making speeches against the national security in March 1969. Ex president of the Diretoria Academico '21st of April' university of Goias. Very reliable information indicates that he was not involved in any violence and has been very badly tortured. Was a medical student at the university. First arrest 1968, was freed. Kidnapped by police in Goiania on 18.11.71. Is held at Policia Especial, Setor Militar, CODI, Brasilia. S 6/5

A Thomaz Miguel PRESSBURGER: Convicted in a group of 28 people in Brasilia for attempting to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party. Conflicting reports of sentences of 3½ and 6½ years. 6

Germany 301

A Wilson de Carvalho REIS: Accused along with 15 others of organising the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Sao Joao de Meriti. See case of Osvaldo Jose Lourenco for specific charges against the financial sector. Summing up of case took place in 1970; apparently released 1972, but this is not confirmed. 2

+I Zileia RESNIK: Student, transferred from Sao Judas Tadeu to Bangu Women's Prison, without a warrant, after her arrest for subversive activities. Apparently free but there is a possibility that she will be re-arrested. S 2

A Clodsmit RIANI: Former President of the National Confederation of Industrial Workers. Arrested in 1964 after the military take-over. Released and then re-arrested. Sentenced to 17 years for acts of subversion along with other union leaders. Had been Brazil's representative on the Administrative Council of the International Labour Organisation. Married; several children. Apparently original sentence has been shortened, but it is unclear whether he is now serving two years or longer. Reports of his release are to be confirmed. Mis. TU 9

A Cleomenes de Paula RIBEIRO: DOPS in Sao Paulo asked for his preventative imprisonment along with 19 others on charges of attempting to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in 3 towns of the state of Sao Paulo. Apparently free awaiting trial by the 2nd Military Court in Sao Paulo. 3

I Nelson RODRIGUES Filho: 26 years old; engineer. Formerly an employee of the secretariat of public works in the state of Guanabara. Arrested by CODI in Rio. Accused of subversive activities, but denied this charge at his trial. Apparently involved in several suits. Mis. 2

I Paulo Cesar Lopes da Silva RODRIGUES: Accused of subversive activities. - A Alcindo Augusto da SILVA: Student from Ribeirao Preto; accused in 1970 for attempting to re-establish the extinct Communist Party in 3 towns in the state of Sao Paulo. Held in preventative prison until trial in 1972 at which time he may have been acquitted. Confirmation of latter is being sought. S 7  
 Lawyer: Unknown Golders Gn & Hendon Germany 217
- A Antonio Padua SILVA: accused with 19 others of trying to establish cells of the extinct Communist Party in 3 towns in the state of Sao Paulo. Preventative imprisonment requested by DOPS in 1970. 3
